The examination has five parts.

- The first and third parts are written and the second, fourth and fifth parts are oral.

 - 2. Oral-self assessment (oral)
 - 3. A written assignment (written)
 - 4. A short oral presentation of the assignment you chose (oral)
 - 5. Reading comprehension (oral)

Descriptions of each part

1. Vocabulary

- a. Prepare a **vocabulary list** of at least 15 words taken from the assignment you have chosen. They are to be **related to the theme** of your assignment.
- b. Find English synonyms for the words you have chosen.
- c. Find the Icelandic translation of each word.
- d. **Compose a sentence** including each word so that the meaning can be clearly understood.
- e. **Set up the list** in an organized fashon and send it to the teacher by email.

2. Oral self-assessment

- a. What did you learn by working with this theme?
- b. What did you get practice in?
- c. What did you get better at?
- d. Prepare a list of points about what you learned or got practice in regarding:
 - The use of the English language
 - The material you worked with
 - How you do best at studying English
- e. Have your list of points with you in the oral examination.
- f. It will be your responsibility to remember to take take the list with you!

3. Your written assignment

- In the oral interview you will be talking about this assignment of yours with your teacher. You will be required to be able to answer questions about it.
 - a. You have chosen one of your written assignments done this winter as the subject of your examination.
 - b. Make sure you have considered the teacher's comments and requests and improved it as much as you can.
 - c. Send it to me by e-mail to your teacher before the given cut-off point.

4. A short oral presentation of the assignment you chose

- a. During the interview, you will make a short, concise report on your assignment for about two minutes.
- b. You may give a general overview of the whole thing, or discuss more deeply a particular aspect of your assignment which appealed to you.
- c. You are allowed to have talking points with you, or a transparancy which you have prepared to talk from.
- d. After your report, you will be expected to answer some questions about your assignment for a few minutes

Part 5. Reading comprehension

- a. After the interview, you will be given a short text on the subject of your assignment of choice.
- b. You will read the text fairly quickly.
- c. Then answer a few questions about meaning of it.
