- Use rubrics to plan detailed trait writing instruction for specific grade levels
- Use rubrics to provide students with effective feedback
- Align the writing process and trait instruction to build a seamless system
- Map out a year of trait writing instruction and create lesson plans
- Build a learning community that shares a common vocabulary and vision of quality writing performance as it serves Multi-language learners and diverse cultures

ASSESSMENT & SCORING:

- Practice scoring student work samples using clearly defined and sometimes (K-2) illustrated rubrics for the K–12 grade levels.
- Review, explore, and apply teacher/student-tested writing lessons for each trait
